From my viewpoint, I am ready for fall with the air conditioner turned off.

The Tamarack Fairways Board of Directors is a group of volunteers elected by the homeowners to help maintain the subdivision's By-Laws and Restrictions. I am confident that no one volunteers for the HOA Board to be a bill collector. However, each year around 20% of the homeowners fail to pay their annual assessment fee by February 15th. We then spend the year attempting to collect the unpaid annual assessment fee.

This year attempting to improve the annual assessment fee process, we established a late fee of \$50.00 if the 2025 balance due is unpaid by February 15, 2025. In addition, if unpaid by March 15, 2025, we will consider sending the balance due to collections. Before sending any homeowners with balance due to collections, Board members are currently visiting each homeowner to verify that we have the correct contact information. We still have 25 homeowners with balance due or 13%.




If you've been thinking about downsizing to lower your expenses, be closer to family, or just make life easier, here's a trend worth paying attention to:


#### **How Downsizers Are Turning Equity into Buying Power**

#### 1. Clean Up Spent Annuals and Weeds

Remove any annual flowers, vegetables, and weeds that are past their prime. This helps prevent pests and diseases from overwintering in your beds. Cut back perennials, but leave some seed heads (like coneflowers and ornamental grasses) to provide winter interest and food for birds.

#### 2. Add a Layer of Mulch

A 2–4 inch layer of mulch around your perennials, shrubs, and trees helps insulate the soil, lock in moisture, and protect roots from temperature swings. Use shredded leaves, bark mulch, or straw for a natural blanket of protection.

#### 3. Protect Trees and Shrubs

Young trees and sensitive shrubs need extra care in the Midwest cold. Wrap tree trunks with protective tree wrap to prevent frost cracks and animal damage. For evergreens, consider burlap screens to shield them from drying winter winds.

#### 4. Plant Bulbs Now for Spring Blooms

Imagine your yard bursting with color next spring—daffodils, tulips, crocuses, and hyacinths all start with planting bulbs now. Plant them before the ground freezes, in well-drained soil, sunny spots, at the right depth, and give bulbs a good boost with bulb fertilizer. A little work this fall means a dazzling show when winter fades.

#### 5. Water Before the Freeze

Give your trees, shrubs, and perennials a deep drink before the ground freezes. Well-watered plants are healthier and less likely to suffer winter damage.

#### 6. Bring Tender Plants Indoors

Tropical plants, succulents, and houseplants should come inside well before frost. Check for pests, prune lightly, and place them in a sunny window or under grow lights.

#### 7. Create a Wildlife-Friendly Winter Garden

Leave some seed heads, berries, and brush piles to provide food and shelter for birds and beneficial insects. Your garden can become a haven for wildlife, even in the snow.

#### 8. Prep for Holiday Décor

After cleaning and mulching your beds, add some seasonal touches! Containers filled with evergreens, berries, and twinkle lights can brighten your porch through the long winter months. With a little planning, your garden will not only survive but thrive after a Midwest winter. Taking time to clean, mulch, water, and protect plants now will reward you with lush growth and early blooms next spring. Plus, a well-prepped garden looks tidy and inviting—even under a blanket of snow!

# How to Measure Your Risk Tolerance for Investing

One of the first conversations financial advisors have with clients is about risk tolerance—your ability and willingness to accept potential losses in the value of your investments. Knowing your risk tolerance helps determine the investments most suitable for your goals, comfort level, and financial situation.

Many investors think of risk only in terms of losing money, but risk is broader than that. It is about how much uncertainty you can accept while still staying invested. Some people feel comfortable seeing their portfolio drop temporarily because they know markets usually recover over time. Others lose sleep even over small declines. Identifying where you fall on this spectrum is important for long term success.

#### Step 1: Understand Your Financial Situation

The first part in measuring risk tolerance is understanding your personal financial situation. If you have stable income, an emergency fund, and little debt, you may be better equipped to take on investment risk. For example, a younger investor with decades until retirement may tolerate more swings in the market than someone close to retirement who relies on their savings for living expenses.

#### Step 2: Clarify Your Goals

Your specific goals help determine how much risk is appropriate. If you need money for a down payment on a house in the next couple of years, taking big risks in the stock market may not be wise, since short-term volatility could hurt you. However, with long term goals such as retirement, taking more risk in that portfolio can be wise since the ups and downs of riskier investments offer higher returns overtime.

#### Step 3: Consider Your Personality and Comfort Level

Your personality and emotions play a significant role in determining your risk tolerance. Ask yourself: How would you feel if your investment dropped 20% in one year? Would you see it as an opportunity to buy more at a discount, or would you panic and sell at a loss? Your emotions matter, because panic selling during market declines locks in losses and jeopardizes long-term plans.

#### Step 4: Use Risk Tolerance Tools

Financial advisors often use questionnaires to measure time horizon, comfort with market swings, and investment preferences. These tools help identify whether someone leans conservative, moderate, or aggressive, and serve as a practical starting point for building a portfolio. As we gain a deeper understanding of the client's goals and experiences, these insights become more accurate and more valuable.

#### Step 5: Revisit Regularly

Risk tolerance is not static. Major life events such as marriage, children, job shifts, or retirement—can all alter how much risk is appropriate to take. Reassessing your tolerance every few years or after significant changes in life is important to ensure your investment strategy stays aligned with your needs and goals.

#### **Final Thoughts**

Measuring your risk tolerance is about balancing growth potential with peace of mind. When you align your goals, finances, and comfort level, you can invest more confidently, remain calm through unexpected market events, and increase your odds of a living the life you want.

- Haunted houses and other spooky attractions


#### **OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES:**

# Increasing Your Situational Awareness

Situational awareness is being attentive to surroundings to reduce risks and enhance personal safety. While it may sound simple, distractions and fast-paced routines make it challenging. Practicing this skill helps prevent crime, avoid accidents, and stay prepared.

#### **KEY TIPS FOR SITUATIONAL AWARENESS:**

Sharing timely crime prevention information relevant to residents to improve awareness and crime prevention efforts throughout the City of Naperville. Please pass this information on to your fellow neighbors through your HOA's newsletter, email distribution list or social media sites.



- Predict events: Anticipate future actions based on what's happening around you. Thinking ahead improves decision-making.
- Identify elements: Notice not only potential threats but also ordinary factors like people, objects, and environmental changes.
- · Keep your head up: Avoid being absorbed by phones or other devices, which limit awareness of surroundings.
- Use peripheral vision: Train yourself to monitor activity outside your central focus for a wider sense of awareness.
- Don't just look—see: Observe exits, unusual objects, or suspicious behavior when entering a room or public space.
- Avoid overload: Too many tasks or distractions cause errors and stress; prioritize and minimize distractions.
- Prevent fatigue: Rest well and maintain energy levels since tiredness diminishes vigilance.
- Clear your mind: Confusion causes missed signals and mistakes while boosting a potential threat's confidence.
- Guard against complacency: Staying in a comfort zone or assuming everything is fine lowers alertness. Periodically check your mindset.
- Engage your senses: Use sight, hearing, smell, and touch to detect changes in your environment.
- Trust instincts: If a situation feels wrong, remove yourself, ask for help, or call 911.
- Reassess continually: Environments change quickly; ongoing evaluation helps you respond effectively.

Ultimately, practicing situational awareness is about staying alert, attentive, and engaged, both mentally and physically. Doing so can help avoid dangerous encounters, prevent accidents, and recognize criminal behavior before it occurs.


